Established in the Fall of 2022 as a course offering in NCTC's Visual & Performing Arts and Adult & Continuing Education Divisions, the ensemble gives NCTC students an opportunity to perform sophisticated music alongside accomplished adult musicians, many of whom have graduate degrees in music performance and music education. The ensemble rehearses on Monday evenings at NCTC's First State Bank Exchange Campus in Downtown Denton.

# *Music Director*

Dr. Thomas Singletary is an active conductor, composer, clinician, and music educator. A composer and transcriber for winds, he is highly regarded for his custom music arrangements for high school and collegiate marching bands around the nation.



A Georgia native, Singletary holds degrees in Music Education from Florida State University and the University of Illinois at Champaign/Urbana. He earned a Ph.D. in Music Education and Wind Conducting from Florida State University, where he served as a teaching assistant for the university bands. Subsequently, Dr. Singletary taught music education courses and performing ensembles at Morehead State University in Kentucky, and he has served as Instrumental Music Director at North Central Texas College since 2019.

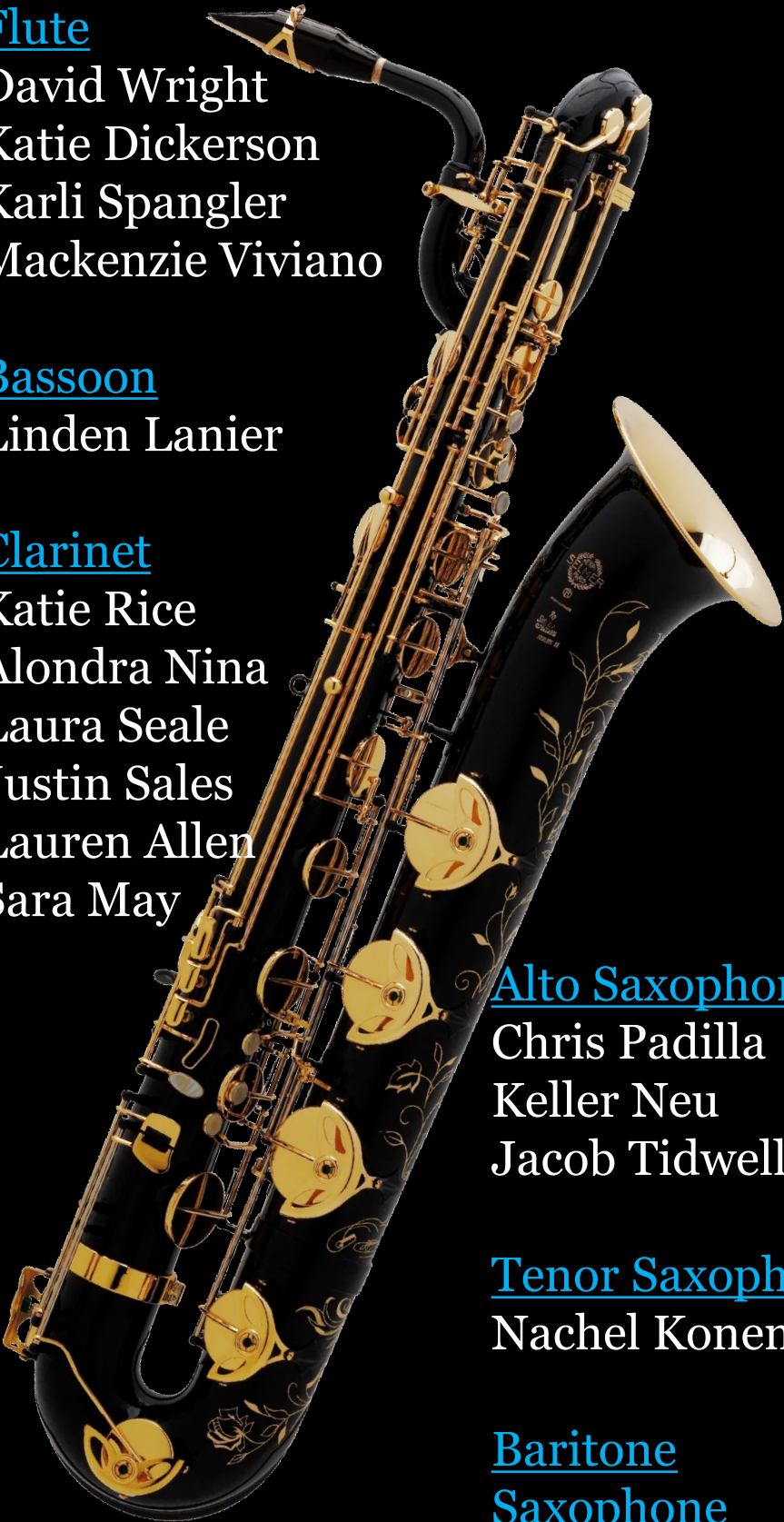

# MUSIC at *North Central Texas College*

The NCTC Music Department is an excellent place for students to prepare for enrolling in a school of music at a four-year college or university. Our department features multiple choral and instrumental ensembles that perform concerts in the fall and spring semesters. Music Majors at NCTC take courses in music theory, ear training, music literature, and private instruction help our students become successful and confident musicians who are ready to audition into music programs at large, comprehensive four-year schools. In the past three years, NCTC music students have been accepted in the music programs at Texas Tech University,



the University of North Texas, Texas Woman's University, Sam Houston State University, and Stephen F. Austin State University.

Music classes meet on two of our six campuses, in Gainesville and Denton. The hub of the NCTC Music Department is the First State Bank Performing Arts Center on our Gainesville Campus, featuring a 350-seat theatre, practice rooms, a music learning lab, rehearsal halls, and studio/office space for our faculty.
