Subsequently, Dr. Singletary taught music education courses and performing ensembles at Morehead State University in Kentucky, and he has served as Instrumental Music Director at North Central Texas College since 2019.

MUSIC at North Central Texas College

The NCTC Music Department is an excellent place for students to prepare



for enrollment in a school of music at a four-year university. Our department features multiple choral and instrumental ensembles that perform in the fall and spring semesters. The Music Pathway at NCTC features courses in music theory, ear training, music literature, class piano, performance ensembles, and private instruction. In the past four years, NCTC music students have been accepted in the music programs at Texas Tech University, the University of

North Texas, Texas Woman's University, Sam Houston State University, Texas Wesleyan University and Stephen F. Austin State University.
